## Indians Finish Fourth at Bend

The Dallas track and field teams went to Bend Saturday to compete in the Cinderama there and, minus one of their leading sprinters and javelin thrower, took fourth place in the seven-team meet.

Bend, showing the strength that was anticipated, won the meet, compiling 74 3/5 points. Redmond was second with 61 1/5, followed by Madras, 39 1/5; The Dalles, 35 2/5; Prineville, 22 2/5; and Burns and Sisters with 8 each.

Missing from The Dalles contingent was Gary Morioka, the Indians' ace sprinter who pulled a leg muscle in practice Friday and didn't make the trip, and Randy Martin, javelin thrower, who was engaged in another school activity.

It was the sprinters who pretty well determined the results as the sprinters composed track relay teams. Bend won the two-mile, 880 and 440-yard relays in addition to the broad jump and high jump relays.

Coach Al Miller, despite the fourth-place finish, wasn't disappointed in the showing of the Indians. Although losing the high jump in the cumulative score to Bend, senior Rex Chambers of the Lava Bears cleared only 5-10 to lead the Bears to a first in that event. Junior Ben Rowland of The Dalles turned in his best jump of the season thus far, 5-8, and The Dalles finished fourth in that event.

Bend, in winning the 800-yard relay did it 1:34.3. Although three steps back and taking a fourth in this event, The Dalles finished in 1:39.8, just 5.5 seconds off the winning pace. Dick Selders, Dennis Anghilante, Mike Fitzgerald and Ken Bailey ran this event.

Two sophomores, a junior and senior combined to give The Dalles a second in the two-mile relay. Sophomores Harry Shandara and Jack Miller ran their 800-yard laps in 2:08.2 and 2:11 respectively while senior Gary Smith ran it 2:00.5 and junior Lynn Harmon rounded the track twice in 2:12.6 for a total 8:41.3 to Bend's winning 8:23.6.

The Indians' next meet is against powerful Pendleton here this Friday, starting at 3:30 p. m. Both the varsity and junior varsity will compete.
