## Indians Host, Travel Friday and Saturday

Another full weekend of inter-school sports competition lies in store for The Dalles High School athletes again, with two big doubleheaders for the varsity baseball team and an inter-state, eight-school track meet for the track and field teams.

Noel Aronson's diamondmen Friday night host the Redmond Panthers in the Indians' third doubleheader in Intermountain League (Western Division) play. First game is scheduled to begin at 5:30 p. m. Saturday, the Indians travel to Pendleton where they face a tough and once-defeated nine of Buckaroos.

Pendleton's only loss to date was a 4-3 decision to Pasco during the opening game doubleheader last Saturday in Pendleton. Until then, the Bucks had a string of 11 wins. Pendleton is leading the Eastern Division of the conference with a 4-0 record.

The Indians, 4-9 for the season and 1-3 in the Western Division,

could take a pair here Friday night. The Panthers are 0-4. In addition, one of the Indians' heavy swingers, first baseman George Vass, got back in the lineup last weekend. He hit the team's first home run in league play against Bend.
