Trackmen Trip Goldendale Foes

On Monday, April 16, the day was calm and the sun beat down in one of the hottest days of the year. The Indian trackmen pushed forward in all events to win a decisive victory over Goldendale. The Indians, evidently not bothered by the heat, showed improvement in all events.

In the sprints Gary Morioka had to be content as a spectator due to a leg injury from the previous week. Mike Fitzgerald, however, came through for the Indians winning both the 100 yd. dash and the 200 with Larry Glenn taking the seconds in both. From there, John Pierra captured the 440 in 56.6, only .2 ahead of Tom Webb. Then Harry Skandera galloped his way to another mile win in 4.44.0., while the field event men began capturing a few firsts of their own. Ken Bailey took firsts in the shot and discus and Dennis Anghilante, who is usually a runner, threw the javelin over 150 ft. to win that event.

In the jumping events Bill Gustafson cleared 10 ft. for a first in the pole vault while Ron Rowland took third in the high jump and Forrest Streb second in the broad jump. Final meet score favored the Indians, 88-36.

Most of the boys have been training the past week without interruption; however Mr. Miller traveled with four boys, Harry Skandara, Tom Webb, John Morriss, and Lynn Harmon to the Hayward Relays in Eugene. This team took third in the Distance Medley with a time of 11.72.2.
