Bailey Sets Put Record

Dalles senior Ken Bailey put the shot 48 feet, five inches Saturday to set a school record and Bill Tye of Bend set one of four sub-district track records when he pole vaulted 12 feet.

Bailey, who also qualified for the District 7 A-1 track meet here Saturday in the discus throw, bettered a year-old mark set by Lyle Campbell. The former school record was 48-1/4.

Tye easily beat out the competition in the pole vault, his nearest competitor being Bill Frenzel of Redmond with an 11-0 mark. Tye, in an effort to improve his jump, nearly cleared 12-3. The old vault record also was set last year. Gary Romine at Redmond who cleared 11-0.

Other new Western Division subdistrict track records are 53.3 seconds in the 440-yard dash set by Bend's Herb Mickman (old record, 54.7, Russell Shroyer, Prineville, 1961); 2:03.7 in the 800-yard run by Bend's John Cutter (old record by Herb Hickman, Bend, 2:06.4, 1961); 5-11 1/2 high jump by Bend's Rex Chambers (old record, 5-11, Bob Durfee, Redmond, 1961).

Bend won The Dalles-hosted meet, compiling 82 points, followed by Redmond 67 1/2, The Dalles 48 and Prineville 14. Pendleton won the Eastern Division meet at Hermiston with 163 1/2, followed by Hermiston 108 3/5, La Grande 71 1/2, Baker 50 1/2 and Ontario 38 3/5.
