The following are the six best times, distances and heights set during the two subdistrict track meets at The Dalles and Hermiston a week ago. Several of the marks are not indicative of the particular athlete's ability. Bend's Dave Fletcher, for instance, has run the 100 in 9.9, the 220 in 21.1 and the 440 in 51.0. Saturday, if approved by the OSAA, he'll be running in the two shorter sprints. If not, the 440, in which he took a fourth at the subdistrict meet. At the Bend Invitational a week ago, he took a spill, because of a leg cramp, resulting in difficulty at the subdistrict meet. In the high jump, both Rex Chambers of Bend and Ray Hughes of Pondleton have cleared 6-0 in earlier season meets. Neither did in the subdistrict meets, but then neither of them was pushed.
