SENIOR KEN BAILEY of The Dalles won't be going to the state track meet at Corvallis later this month, but Saturday he broke his own record and established a new school record, putting the shot 48-5 $\frac{3}{4}$.

THIRD, BUT STILL A RECORD

Ken Bailey, Dalles senior who literally gave his all in the District 7 A-1 meet here Saturday, was a little depressed when he donned his sweats for the last time at the shot put oval.

The best he could do that day was third, with a 48-5 $\frac{3}{4}$ lob. Dick Horyna of Ontario won the event with a 49-6, and Bend's Lee Cottingham was second with a 48-10 $\frac{1}{2}$ mark.

Bailey had hit the 51-foot range in practice during the week, Coach Al Miller told us earlier, but the big heave eluded the husky athlete in district.

Though taking a third, it still bettered the school record Bailey himself set only a week earlier in the subdistrict meet—48-5.

Bailey won't be getting into state competition this year, but he set a shot put standard that could stand for a long time.

And speaking of records, nine District 7 A-1 marks, one of which has stood since 1910, were broken during the meet here Saturday, indicating that there is constructive value in a well-rounded athletic program.

The most notable, perhaps, was in the 880-yard run. The name "Peare," La Grande, 1910, stood in the books until Saturday. And it was beaten then, not once, but twice. Bend's Herb Hickman was clocked in 2:00.5 and John Cutter, also of Bend, was tabbed at 2:01.6. And John Merriss of The Dalles wasn't too far off the winning pace with a 2:06.2.
