## Thin-Clads Capture Two Meets Vault Records Broken at Both

Although having to "huck" a little bad weather and poor track conditions The Dalles Indian trackmen have competed in two meets this past week, winning them both. The first of the two was held at Hood River where the Indians took the varsity with 79½ points from the hosts, Wy-East and Cascade Locks. The

J.V. was also taken by the Indians with 74 points followed by Hood River with 49½ points. The second meet was the Mid-Columbia Relays held at The Dalles last Friday where the Indians also took first with 198½ points over Parkrose 12½, Reynolds, Hood River, Corbett, Cascade Locks and Maupin.

At the Hood River meet last week the Indians had three boys who picked up double wins. Loren Craber took the high hurdles with a 16.1 and the broad jump with 17.5 ft. Gary Moriska dominated the sprints by taking the 100 in 14.5 and the 200 in 29.9 while Harry Scandara did the same in the distances with a 4:48.7 mile and a 2:06.3 half mile. In the field events a new record was set with Steve Lawrence doing 11 ft. 7 in. in the pole vault, beating the old record 11.6 by one inch. ¶

In the latter meet held in The Dalles the only double winner was Loren Craber with wins in both high and low hurdles. Indian Sophomore Gary Ordway took a second and third in the same events. The sprint medley was won in 2:32.9 by Miller, Sellers, Merriss and Bailey. Larry Glenn captured the 100 dash in 14.5 while John Merriss took the 200 in 2:08.

Strangely enough as The Dalles pole vault record was broken in Hood River, the Hood River record was also broken in The Dalles. Frank Easterly vaulted 11 ft.  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch, to break HB's old record of 11. Easterly also took the event and was closely followed by Indian John Altendorf with 10 ft. 6 in. The next meet will be at home tomorrow in a dual with Redmond.
