Portland and San Francisco shift the scene of the Western Hockey League playoff semi-finals tonight, with the two teams taking 1-1 records into the third game at San Francisco.

The Seals managed to earn a split in the first two games at Portland—a feat not to be sniffed at since they hadn't won at Portland all year until their 3-2 victory Tuesday.

Meanwhile the Northern Division semi-finals got under way at Vancouver Wednesday night with a 3-2 Vancouver win over Seattle in a game that produced enough tension for the entire best-of-seven series.

# Varsity, Junior High Track Records Set

Two more records went by the boards yesterday when The Dalles won a three-way meet here with Redmond and Goldendale.

Senior John Merriss set a new DHS track mark, running the 880 yard run in 2:03.9, breaking the 2:06.0 he ran in 1961. But Merriss didn't win the event. That was done by Van Trobe of Goldendale who skirted the oval in 2:01.2.

The other record is a new junior high school mark by freshman Steve Ford. He ran it in 2:15.7 while in the jayvee events. The old record of 2:18.6 was run by Bob Runie last year. Runie won this jayvee event yesterday in 2:13.5.

The Dalles scored 69½ points to 16½ for Goldendale and 41 for Redmond. The Dalles jayvees also won their meet with 88 points to 40 for Redmond and 16 for Goldendale. Redmond did not bring a full jayvee crew.

Scoring was based on the 5-3-2-1 basis.
