

Top Athletes Due Saturday

About 125 of District 7 A1's top prep athletes will convene in The Dalles Saturday and compete in 14 events of the district track meet.

The first two finishers in each of the events will qualify for the state meet at Oregon State University, Corvallis, May 24-25, plus those who equal the events standards and do not have more than two teammates in the same event.

The first and second place finishers in the district meet, including the relay, will qualify for the state meet.

Standards set down by the Oregon School Activities Association include:

High Hurdles, 15.0; Low Hurdles, 20.1; 100-Yard Dash, 10.1; 220-Yard Dash, 22.5; 440-Yard Dash, 51.5; 880-Yard Run, 2:00.0; Mile Run, 4:30.0; 880-Yard Relay, 1:31.0; Shot Put, 53.0; Discus Throw, 150.0; Javelin Throw, 190.0; Broad Jump, 22.0; High Jump, 6.0; Pole Vault, 12.4.

The standards are for the purpose of saving many potentials from making the long trip to Corvallis. The standards, according to the OSAA, must be met in the district meet only. Not even the subdistrict or qualifying heats count toward these standards, says the OSAA.

"Finals consist of the last sev-

en throws or jumps in the weight and broad jump, high jump and pole vault in the final day only. Races include the final district championship effort," adds the OSAA.

The standards evidently are high enough so far as the Inter-mountain League competitors are concerned, for only eight athletes have "met" the standards, according to their subdistrict marks.

Three of them in three events are from Pendleton — Bob Thorne and Ted Cary, the 100-Yard Dash in 10.0; Cary, the 220-Yard Dash in 22.5 (Thorne in 22.6); Moe Ashcroft, 13 feet in the pole vault; Lackey, Ontario, 12.0; Thorne, the broad jump 22.1; Roger Sanvold, Pendleton, 22.1.

And one each from Hermiston, Bud Stratton, the broad jump, 22.4; Madras, Wayne Maw, the 440-Yard Dash, 50.1; and Bend, Bill Hutton, 20.00.5 in the low hurdles.

The best subdistrict times in the other events last weekend were: High Hurdles, Bill Hutton, Bend, 15.2; 880-Yard run, Herb Hickman, Bend, 2:03.3; 880-Yard Relay, Pendleton, Cary, Sandvold, Larson, Thorne, 1:34.0; Discus Throw John Holmes, Redmond, 136-11; Javelin Throw, Jim Leag-

ard, Bend, 176-2½; High Jump, Russ Bowman, La Grande, 5-9.

While the district's thinclads have been preparing to come to the Dalles, the host school has been readying for the meet.

Athletic director Don Martin enlisted the aid of several local men who have indicated they will assist in the meet.

Don Bailey has been named meet chairman, to be assisted by Stan Cowan, recorder; Pascal Arritola, clerk; finish judges Frank Faught, George Kane, Mike Fitzgerald, Dick Yecny, Bob Smith, Doug Leash and Harold Craber; timers Lloyd Ordway, Dr. Dan Merriss, Art Smith, Frank Skandera, Ed Dick, Jim L. John-

son, Jerry Urness, Ray Hotka; starter Don Grubb; announcer Sam Owen; and field event officials Jack Newton, Ivan Lehman, Jim Pierson, Keith Tucker, Jerry Browne and Herman Ziegler.

Alonnie Hattenhauer, Northwest Cherry Queen, will award the ribbons. Weather preceding the meet has been warm, indicating a fast track. The meet begins at 1 p. m., at the Thompson Street site.
