Bend Second, Madras Third, DHS Fourth

Pendleton, figured to finish second in the Intermountain League (District 7-A1) track meet, did better than that Saturday in a cloudless, windless, hot The Dalles.

It scored about six more points than favored Bend and won despite speedster Bob Thorne's weakened leg because of a pulled muscle in the subdistrict meet at La Grande last weekend.

Pendleton totaled 112 1/2 points, followed by Bend 106 1/2. Madras 52. The Dalles 44 1/2. Hermiston 32 1/2. La Grande 24 1/2. Redmond 20. Baker 14. Mac-Hi and Ontario 9. and Prineville 8.

Three district records were broken. Junior Wayne Maw of Madras, who won the 440-yard dash, ran once around the quarter-mile oval in 50.1 seconds, breaking the old standard of 51.5 ran by Dave Walker of Pendleton in 1962.

Ray Melvin of Hermiston set a new standard in the mile run, rounding the circuit four times in 4:32.3, besting the old mark of 4:36.4 run by Hermiston's Ralph Bennison in 1962.

Finally, Bend's speed merchant Bill Hutton ran the low hurdles in 20.0 seconds, breaking the three-year old record of 20.1 run by Ed Anghilante of The Dalles in 1960.

where Maw and Bend's Herb Hickman both were clocked across the finish line in 50.1, but Hickman was disqualified because a corner judge told officials he'd run out of his lane.

Meet officials delved into the rules and noted a 440 runner is not to leave his lane, and ruled the disqualification.

The enforcement of that ruling and also the scratching of Bend from the 880-yard relay for the same kind of violation contributed to Bend placing second in the meet.

And speaking of The Dalles, senior Steve Lawrence, in winning the pole vault with a 12-2¼ leap, bested a Dalles High School record that was just a week old. A week ago, in the subdistrict meet at Bend, junior John Altendorf cleared 11-11¼, which itself was a new school mark that had broken Lawrence's previous new record set back at the first of this season, 11-6.

And the ironic part of Lawrence's record leap is that he did it with a fiberglass pole he had only a week to get used to—one being purchased from Redmond because The Dalles' one pole was snapped about three weeks ago.

Two other DHS tracksters going to the state meet this weekend are distance runner John Merriss, who, though finishing in a tie for second Saturday, won the flip of a coin Sunday and got the nod. He and Harold Delmarter of Pendleton tied for second in this event in 4:32.6. The winning time, incidentally, was 4:32.3, to give an idea of the closeness of the race. Merriss also ran the 800 and, though finishing fourth in that event, equalled his school record time in this event of 2:03.9.

Finally, one of coach Al Miller's hardest working athletes, Junior Loren Craber, also gets the nod to go to the state meet.

Craber ran the high hurdles in 15.3 seconds (15.1 won it) to place second to Bend's Hutton.

Perhaps one of the most exciting races of the day was the 400
