Pendleton Captures Track Title; Indians Qualify Three for State

For all but 36 athletes and seven coaches the 7A-1 District track season came to an end last Saturday. These 36 contestants will compete at the state meet to be held at Corvallis this Saturday in which they qualified. Pendleton, who captured five first places and the District 7A-1 title, led the field with 112 points. Bend took second with 108½ points, while Madras edged out the hosting Dalles Indian's 44¼ with 52 total. Hermiston was fifth with 32¼, La Grande, sixth with 24¼ and Redmond seventh with 20. There were 11 teams competing.

The Indians will be represented by three thin-clads at the state meet. Loren Craber qualified with his second in the high hurdles in a time of 15.3, only .2 off the winning time. Next to qualify was John Merriss, who tied for second in the mile with Harold Dalamarter but was awarded the birth at the state meet on the flip of a coin. The final boy to represent the Indians is Steve Lawrence, who won the pole vault with 12'2¼" and set a new school record. Previous record was held at 11'11¼" by John Altendorf.

In the field events the meet

ran as follows. Harris of Madras jumped 5'9¼" for first and Bowman of La Grande took second. Freshman Phil Wagenblast, who is an outstanding potential for the Indians, tied for fifth. The shot put was dominated by McCarty of Bend with 50'3"; second was Clowers of Madras with 49'10". The broad jump extended to 20'9" by Cary of Pend., followed by Usher of Bend. The javelin was lofted 180'3" by Leo-Jeld, Bend and second, 166'8" by Bell of Baker. Baily of La Grande took the discuss with 139'4½", second was Smith of Bend. Lawrence in the polevault was followed by Ashcroft of Pend. and Altendorf of The Dalles, both with 11'6".
