Tribe Thinclads to Open Season; Track Records Expected to Fall

March 18 will mark the opening of what looks to be a promising track season as the Indian Thinclads travel to Portland to compete with Jefferson High and several other strong, Portland area schools.

As many as half a dozen school track and field records could be set during the '64 season. The Indians look to be strong in the discus, javelin, pole vault, and hurdle events while the distance runners, led by Harry Skandera,

Skandera, hampered the past track season by leg injuries, is one of Coach Al Miller's best prospects. Junior weight-man Marnie Moore has already surpassed the school discus record and hopes to make it an official mark at Jefferson.

John Altendorf, who held the DHS pole vault record last year only to be bettered by ex-Indian Steve Lawrence, hopes to regain his title. Altendorf has vaulted 12 feet compared to the standing record of 12'2".

Three lettermen will return to compete in the hurdle event. Gary Ordway, Loren Craber, and Phil Wagenblast are the returnees. They each also enter other events to bolster all-around strength.

After the Jefferson meet, the Thinclads will condition themselves for the Willamette Relays to be held March 28. The first home meet is scheduled for April 3 when The Dalles will host the Second Annual Mid-Columbia Relays.
