

## Moore Shatters Discus Mark: Relays Next on Track Slate

Junior weightman Moore lived up to preseason expectations as he shattered the standing school discus mark in the opening meet of the Indian track season at Jefferson High in Portland Moore buried the rubber plate 141' 6" to erase Jim Taylor's 1957 mark that stood at 137' 8"
