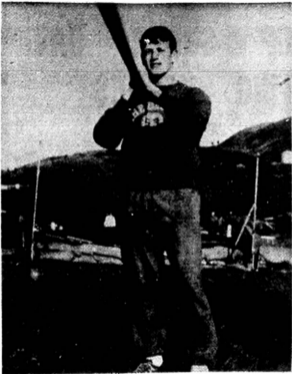

Altendorf Sets New Vault Mark

John Altendorf set a new DHS pole vault record Saturday in the Hayward Relays at Eugene.

He cleared 12 feet, nine inches, breaking a record of 12-4½ he'd set at Wy'east only nine days earlier.

Altendorf, who also broke his fiberglass pole when trying to improve on his new mark, bettered the meet record set in 1963 by Mark Henningsgaard of Cottage Grove.

Last year, Henningsgaard vaulted 12-8, but he came back this year and soared to a still new meet mark of 13-6 to win this event in the Class A division.

Altendorf's 12-9 took second in the event. He was the only DHS track man in the meet.

Meanwhile, the rest of The Dalles track squad traveled to Walla Walla Friday where it placed third in the annual Wa-Hi Relays.

Nine schools from both Washington and Oregon entered, with Pendleton finishing a strong first with 70 points, followed by Pasco 38, The Dalles 31, Richland 24, Mac-Hi 22, Kennewick 19, Wa-Hi 18, La Grande 14 and Hermiston 7.

The meet was primarily relays, with four-man teams from each school determining their placing in an event on combined individual scores.

Marnie Moore, a Dalles junior, won the discus throw with a 138-3-foot toss. And The Dalles won the mile relay with a 3:37.4. The DHS team in this instance included Phil Wagenblast, Luther Goin, Gary Ordway and Loren Craber.

Mike Fossum set a new junior high record in the mile with a 4:49.2, bettering the four-year old mark of senior Harry Skandera, 4:55.0.

And in taking a third in the mile relay with a 3:40.3, this time is a new Dalles High School record by Larry Austin, Joe Thompson, Doug Miller and Doug Strub. The old record of 3:44.3, set only last year, was by John Merriss, Austin, Jerry and Jack Miller.

This Friday The Dalles hosts Bend in a dual meet which starts at 3:30 p. m. Bend placed third in the Class A division of the Hayward Relays.
