Altendorf Sails 12-9 at Hayward; Breaks School Vault Mark, Pole

Saturday, April 18, at the Hayward Relays in Eugene, Indian Vaulters John Altendorf sailed 12.9" to capture second place in the meet and also snap his school pole vault mark. But unfortunately, he also snapped the school pole during his first attempt at 13' to prevent him from vaulting any higher. A week earlier at Wy'east, Altendorf broke the record vaulting 12' 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " to erase Steve Lawrence's old mark of 12' 2".

Altendorf was the sole representative at the Eugene meet from The Dalles. The other thin-clads competed the evening before in the Wa-Hi Relays at Walla Walla. Nine teams competed in the Washington meet and the Indians placed third in team points as the scoring went Pendleton 70 Pasco 38, The Dalles 31, Richland 24, Mac-Hi 22, Kennewick 19 Ma-Hi 18, La Grande 14, and Hermiston 7.

Marnie Moore took blue ribbon honors in the discus, tossing the plate 138' 3". The only other

Dalles' first was a tie in the shuttle low hurdles with Loren Craber, Gary Ordway, Phil Wagenblast, and Luther Goin hurdling for the Indians. Another school track time was set as the Mile Relay team consisting of three juniors and a freshman lowered the old record by four seconds. Joe Thompson, Larry Austin, Doug Miller and Doug Stroh ran a 3:40.3 compared to old mark of 3:44.3. The previous record was held by John Merris, Jack Miller, Jerry Miller and Austin.
