Frank Peters Hits 2 Homers In Beaver Win

CORVALLIS (UPD) — Frank Peters slammed two-run homers in the first and third innings and Oregon State went on to defeat Washington 12-6 in a North-ern Division baseball game Friday.

Veeder South hit a home run with two men on and Terry Markham followed with another four-run banger as the Beavers scored five runs in the seventh.

The division left Oregon State with a 3-1 record and the Huskies with a 2-2 mark in the league. The defending champion Beavers are in second place behind Oregon, which is 3-1.

The Dalles Wins Four-Way Meet Here

The Dalles, supported with double wins by Gary Ordway and Marnie Moore, won the four-way meet at Thompson Street Track Friday.

The Indians thinclads amassed 89 points, followed by Redmond with 84½, Wy'east with 25½ and Jesuit with 22. The Dalles and Redmond are of the Intermountain League, Wy'east and Jesuit the Wilco League.

As a double winner, taking both hurdles events, and anchoring the second-place relay team, Ordway picked up 10¾ points. He ran the lows in 15.9 seconds and the highs in 21.5.

Moore won the shotput with 46.3 toss and the discus throw with a 138-3½ mark.

The Dalles took six first places and Redmond seven on the cold, windy day, and Wy'east won the other.

Other Dalles firsts were scored by Jerry Miller, who broad-jumped 20-8¼; and by John Altendorf, the pole vault in 12-0.

Two new Dalles Junior High School records were set. Luther Goin set one in the 180-yard low hurdles. He ran fourth in the varsity event, but finished in 22.3 seconds. This bettered Ordway's 1962 record of 22.6.

The other mark was by Ernie Tuttle in the pole vault. He finished second in the varsity event with a 10-6, bettering his own record of 10-3 set just a week ago in the Bend dual meet.

And speaking of the pole vault, John Altendorf, The Dalles' record holder with a 12-9, nearly topped 13-0. His body cleared it yesterday but his hands unseated the crosspiece. Coach Al Miller says he's got his foot in the door.
