## Sherman Wins Dual Meet, 90-40

MORO—Sherman's Huskies defeated Wahtonka of The Dalles in a dual track meet here Friday, 90-40.

Doug Bish was the high man with 21¼ points, winning the high jump, high and low hurdles and the broad jump, and running a leg of the winning relay team.

One highlight was the breaking of the 10-second barrier by a Sherman sophomore, Ernie Moore. He ran the century in 9.8.

Winning Coach Ordie Hoyer said, however, the run likely was closer to 10.0 because of wind effects.

# Altendorf Sets New Mark; Hurdles Swept

Pendleton defeated The Dalles in a dual track meet at Thompson Street Track Friday, 77-58.

Neither team looked particularly strong. Some of the thin-clads have noted the chilling winds, of which there was an abundance of Friday, disallow them from warming and loosening up as desired.

An example of the less than maximum performance was in the javelin throw. John Carter of Pendleton won it, but with a toss of only 158 feet. He's bettered 172.

Even with a following wind. Roger Sandvold won the 100-yard dash in only 10.1. Doug Miller of The Dalles was second with a 10.2.

Highlight for The Dalles followers, however, was the Indians' sweeping the high hurdles, with meet high point man Loren Craber breaking the tape at 15.6. Second was Phil Wagenblast and Gary Ordway was third.

Craber, a senior who also won the low hurdles in 21.2 and was second in the high jump, totaled 13 team points based on the 5-3-1 scoring system. Sandvold was second with 12¼, winning the 100-yard dash the 220-yard dash and running a leg for the winning 880-yard relay team.

The Dalles set more records. John Altendorf polished the meet with a new mark of 13-4½, bettering his own record of 12-9 cleared April 18 at the Hayward Relays.

One of the reasons he didn't go higher was that the standards aren't geared for it. The
