## Bend Wins 9-School Meet; The Dalles 2nd

**BEND**—Bend handily won the annual running here of the Metric Meet Saturday. Eight schools were entered.

The Lava Bears, which look like a favorite in the subdistrict meet this Saturday at Prineville and the District 7-A1 meet at Hermiston May 29, took nine first places in the 15 events.

Bend compiled 143 points on a 10-7-5-3-1 scoring system, followed by The Dalles 66, Redmond 60 $\frac{1}{2}$ , Crater 53, Madras 41 $\frac{1}{2}$ , Henley 34 $\frac{1}{2}$ , Prineville 16 and Lakeview 13.

Bob Nosler was the meet high point man with 20 points on two first places. He won both hurdle events, running the highs in 15.4 seconds and the lows in 20.4.

High point maker for The Dalles was Marnie Moore who set a new discus record for the Columbia River school. Moore, who scored 15 points, hurled the plate 142 feet, breaking the school record he set at Jefferson in Portland March 18—141.6. Moore also was third in the shot put.

The other first place by The Dalles was in the pole vault. John Altendorf cleared the 12-0 mark. He holds the DHS record of 13-4 $\frac{1}{2}$ .

But the big news in this event is by another Dalles entrant—Eric Ackerman, a sophomore. He cleared 11-6, the second time this

of 13-4½.

But the big news in this event is by another Dalles entrant—Eric Ackerman, a sophomore. He cleared 11-6, the second time this season. He cleared this mark during the dual meet with Bend at The Dalles, April 24.

The meet was not without its sidebar happenings. Ackerman broke the high crossbar, made of wood, and Altendorf came home with five stitches in the side of his noodle.

Both the breaking of the crosspiece and the cut that led up to the stitches came when Ackerman was trying for the 12-foot mark.

When Ackerman vaulted up, the wind, which was gusty in Central Oregon Saturday, caught the blond sophomore as he was hovering over the bar. He dropped, snapping the bar, and the breaking bar pushed one of the temporary standards toward the ground.

Altendorf, who was catching the pole for Ackerman, was concentrating on the pole. The standard, the base of which rests on top of the ground instead of being rooted firmly in footings as is the case at The Dalles, crashed against his head.

DHS Track Coach Al Miller took both vaulters to the Bend hospital where Altendorf was sewn back together and Ackerman had his chest examined. Both thinclads were pronounced sound. They wanted to compete further, but Miller disallowed it.

In the subdistrict meet this Saturday, the five entrants—The Dalles, Bend, Redmond, Prineville and Madras—will be going for the blue chips.

For some of the individual entrants, it will be their last meet of the year. For this is where the cutting begins.

Only the first four places in each event, except the hurdles and relay events where it's the first three, will go on to the district meet. The cropping is to limit the district meet to the
