IN CASE YOU'VE WONDERED, these are most of the DHS records. Ironically, since this photo was taken, four new ones have been set. John Altendorf pole vaulted 13-4½, Marnie Moore hurled the discus 146 feet, Harry Skandera ran the 880 in 2:03.5 and Bing Ott grabbed the two-mile in 10:19.0. District 7-A1 meet is at Hermiston today. It's interesting to note that eight of the 18 marks have been set the last two years, which indicates the heightened interest and efforts here in the track program.
