that "Emphasizes strength speed play." He does all of his running on a track, which makes it easier for him to fit his training to a busy schedule of university work toward a masters degree in recreation management and halftime

work on a federal grant project at Oregon.

Burley's closing comment after his first in-state race in a long while was simple:

"I'll come back here again as long as I'm running and they want me to run."

As for future plans, he says

it will "be hard to justify" leaving his studies for any extended traveling, but he has informed the Amateur Athletic Union that he will be available for a trip or two.

For Lee, a false start in the hurdles was a blessing.

"I was sitting back in the blocks for that first start. I don't know what I was thinking about," he offered sheepishly. The 14.3 was his all-time best, but he admitted the slight wind "helped me a little."

Kjoslo also had some quips, among them, "Harry Jerome? Yep, I know him; I've run behind him a number of times." His 9.5 was just a tenth off his best time established last spring.

Rosco Divine, Oregon's standout freshman from Columbia River of Vancouver, Wash., gave the crowd another good mile, finishing the half in two minutes flat and going 4:13 for the distance with pressure completely absent.

11 Marks Topple

Eleven records fell in the collegiate categories, including a 230-5 javelin throw by John Burns, ex-Oregon Duck competing unattached.

As a team perennial Evergreen Conference power Central Washington was strong, winning a flock of relay events, plus spotting several individual firsts.

Oregon State's John Hergenrather tacked 10 $\frac{1}{4}$ inches on the senior pole vault mark, going 14-11. Gene Triplett of Central Washington went 14-6.
