# Grelle Enjoys 2-Mile Romp

Jim Grelle took an extended lunch hour Saturday and ran 2½ miles to add luster to a triangular track meet at University of Portland, won easily by University of Idaho.

"That's my third best two-mile," the nearly tuned distance ace said following an 8:53.7 effort, then let a smile cross his face. "Of course, I've only run about four."

Grelle, who was an international standout in the mile and 1,500 meters this past year and was named Oregon's athlete of the year, also ran a 1:53.9 half-mile, although he said he "wasn't ready" for the quick lap races yet.

He worked for most of the morning, took time off to compete, then had "two or three hours" of work left to do after the meet.

## Twin Winners Few

In the meet proper, Idaho's depth was just too much. The Vandals amassed 84 points, winning seven of 17 events. Portland totaled 51½ and Lewis and Clark 45. In the dual meet scoring Idaho trimmed both foes soundly and Portland gained a five-point decision over L-C.

Double victories were hard to come by. Manuel Murrell of Coach Doug MacFarlane's Vandals won the broad jump at 23-4 and the high hurdles in 15 seconds flat, teammate Ray McDonald prevailed in the shotput (54-4½) and discus (166-3) and Portland's Mike

Boyle led the pack in the 440 intermediate hurdles (55.1) and triple jump (43-10).

Boyle also had a second in the broad jump (22-3), a fourth in the 100-yard dash (9.9) and ran anchor for UP's second place 44 relay team to total 14¾ points and rank as the meet's high scorer.

McDonald had a third in the intermediate hurdles to add to his firsts for 12 points.

For Boyle, who was still subpar physically from a pulled muscle, it was a good start.

For teammate Don Bowler and Idaho's Bill Bryson, things weren't so bright. Pilot Coach Harley Lewis will probably lose Bowler, a promising middle distance man, for the year with what is diagnosed as a Baker's cyst in his right leg which builds up fluid and puts pressure on the tendons. And for Idaho, Bryson will probably be out for a week or more with a pulled muscle suffered in the 100.

## Dashes Close

That 100-yard dash and the 440 were two of the best races all day.

Bryson boomed out of the blocks a yard ahead of the field at the gun and held off four pursuers in 9.7; his challengers all clocked 9.9. But that effort, plus a strong anchor in the 440 relay earlier, ended his reign.

In the 440, Lewis and Clark sophomore Vern Jones — a miniature in stature compared to the field — scooted to a 50.1 and edged out Idaho's Bob Smith by a tenth of a second.

Chris Miller of Coach Eldon Fix's Pioneers chased Grelle much of the way in the two-mile and managed to post his best clocking this year in winning the event among the collegiate field in 9:18.1. Team-mate Don Aaberg also chopped nearly two seconds from his 880 time, turning in a 1:55.6. And Ross Mouer bided his time through a slow first half mile to sprint by the field in the mile for a 4:14.6. Freshman Ahoi Mench was a step or two behind in 4:15.6.

Mouer also clicked off a 49.8 lap in the mile relay and Jones had a 49.1.

Steve Brown of Idaho won the expected high jump duel hands down, going over 6-6½. Dan Acker of Lewis and Clark had to content himself with 6-4½, still a pretty fair mark for early spring.
