LC Youth Movement Buries Pilot Spikers

Lewis and Clark's track and field youth movement, typified by freshmen double-winners Tim Wright and Paul Stith, overran, outclassed University of Portland, 95-50, in a dual meet Saturday.

It was the first LC victory over the Pilots, in five years and was a breeze after the first few events.

Wright, who shows promise of giving veteran Dan Acker all he can handle in the high jump, went 6-6 for a meet record and topped it off with a first in the triple jump at 41-1-3. Acker cleared 6-4 in the high jump for second.

And Stith provided Pioneer fans with their first look at an LC-stabled top caliber sprinter in some years, winning virtually uncontested races — 10.1 in the 100 and 22.6 in the 220.

Another yearling, Evan Jaqua picked off honors in the high hurdles at 15.8. Sophomores Doug Bell (intermediate hurdles, 40.6), Chuck Bruce (long jump, 21-0), Tom Boyle (javelin, 175-11½) and Kirk Ward (discus, 158-0) added four more firsts.

That meant nine of 13 first places went to underclassmen and the underlings also figured in the 440 and mile relay triumphs. Only Vern Jones (1:55.5 in the 880) and Dave Shilling (50.1 in the 440) upheld the seniors' honor.

But no one seemed to mind on the depth-strong Pioneer unit, least of all Coach Eldon Fix.

"This is a good bunch of young kids, many of them with a lot of promise," he said with a satisfied smile.

The winners snapped a pair of meet marks and Coach Kent Soldan's Pilots added two more. Ward's discus toss was 4-foot, 5-inches better than the old mark and Wright's high jump was an inch above the old standard.

TUCSON (Special) — Opening day pitching selection of 20-year-old righthander Gary Boyd, optioning of outfielder Sam Parrilla and extension of their exhibition game winning streak to six headlined the activity Saturday in the baseball training camp of the Portland Beavers.

Manager John Lipon's Beavers rode the crest of a combined five-hit mound effort from Tom Grumby, Mike Hedlund and Jack Spring, plus clutch singles by shortstop Gordy Lund and catcher Luis Isaac to post a 2-1 victory over Waterbury, Conn.

Mike McCabe ran a blistering final lap to overtake seven-lap leader David Fix of LC and eventual second place finishing teammate Lee Spadoni in a record-breaking 9:25.7. Spadoni clocked 9:25.8 and freshman Fix 9:29.7.

John Altendorf set the other mark for Portland, clearing 14-0 in the pole vault.

One of the better races was Jones' half-mile win. Spadoni pushed him at the turn into the backstretch of the final lap, but Jones held off the challenge, plus a late bid by the Pilots' Don Bowler, for the victory. Bowler was timed in 1:56.8, Spadoni 1:57.4 and even fourth in line Brian Laycoe of LC went under two minutes at 1:59.9.

Lewis and Clark swept five events and went 8-1 in another to make it a rout.
