

OSU Unveils Stars, Snaps Meet Marks

SALEM (Special) — Oregon State could have staged an open track and field meet between its rooks and varsity and not missed much in the translation.

The Beavers, young and old, managed a virtual stranglehold in the collegiate section of the 18th annual Willamette Relays on a sunny but chilly Saturday afternoon at Willamette's McCulloch Stadium. OSU varsity performers walked away with nine first places and the yearlings tossed in seven more.

Officials might be wise to study the possibilities of dedicating the high jump events to their memory, too.

Steve Kelly, a massive-muscled — for a high jumper — young man from the Beaver varsity, gave the Beavers another record in this category with a 6-10 effort. The old mark of 6-8 $\frac{1}{4}$ dated back to 1960.

Just a year ago, John Radeitch of the Rooks went 6-9 $\frac{3}{4}$ for the novice record. He tied for second this time with Lewis and Clark sophomore Tim Wright at 6-8, but Kelly, junior, easily filled the gap.

"He came awfully close to 7 feet, just tipped the bar with his trailing knee," OSU Coach Bernie Wagner commented. "He went 7-0 indoors, but this is his best outdoors for the spring."

Nine Marks Fall

Kelly's mark was one of nine records registered by the college and open competitors, five of them by Oregon State.

The Beavers posted marks in the open 440 relay (41.3 by two-tenths of a second), the two-mile relay (7:48.3 by three-tenths) and the 880 relay (1:26.1 by 2.8 seconds).

Preps Set 1 Record In Relays

SALEM (Special) — Some people are willing to travel a long way to prove a point, and the way records held in the prep division of the Willamette Relays Saturday, the point was made with force.

Only one standard in the track events in the Willamette University annual was toppled, that the two mile relay, and it took four spikers from Clover Park High School, Tacoma, Wash., to do it.

The four Tacomans — Bob Branndon, Jim Burkhart, Wes Smylie and Dean Geralts — ticked off an 8:03.6 in the distance event at McCulloch Stadium. The time eclipsed the one-year-old 8:08.7 set by Hillsboro.

There were only two other records in the "senior" division (larger schools in relays, lettermen in individual events.)

The Beavers posted marks in the open 440 relay (41.3 by two-tenths of a second), the two-mile relay (7:48.3 by three-tenths) and the 880 relay (1:26.1 by 2.8 seconds).

Two more marks went to primarily ex-OSU Staters Track and Field Club competitors. Don Tollefson threw the discus 179-7 and a Staters one-mile relay unit ran 3:21.4.

But chiefly it was Kelly who made fun of the chill and helped atone for some less-than-frantic finishes in the meet's featured invitational events.

Jerome Sits Out

Kelly passed the opening heights until 6-4, didn't have a miss until his first try at 6-10, made it on the second effort and finally stalled at 7 feet.

Probably the biggest bust of the day was ex-Oregon and Canadian Olympian Harry Jerome's failure to compete in the Oliver Huston 100-yard dash. He ran a 9.6 century in an open meet in Eugene Friday and complained of "some stiffness" in his leg Saturday, so watched Onia Bates run 9.8 to take the trophy.

Terry Thompson captured top honors in the Statesman Mile with a 4:13.5 clocking running a strategy race and forgetting the clock. The OSU runner stayed on the heels of an Oregon Track Club entrant, Roy Hammett, while Rook Jim Barklay set the pace.

Pomeroy, Parish Win

"I wanted to let an Oregon guy set the pace for a change," he said with a grin. "That's what they've been doing to beat us for years."

Rook Jay Pomeroy won the Vern Gilmore high hurdles in 14.6, after favorite Don Parish of the OSU varsity slipped at the blocks. Parish came out of the same chute in the open hurdles, which followed, though, and clocked 14.2.

OSU's sprint potential was awesome in its depth. Ernie Smith scooted 21.5 in the kick-

Hillsboro.

There were only two other records in the "senior" division (larger schools in relays, letter men in individual events.)

Steve Athay of Fort Vancouver in Vancouver, Wash. hurled the discus 162-8 to better by 20 inches a mark set in 1961 by Dave Davies of another Vancouver school, Hudson's Bay and Mike Buss of Central of Independence cleared the high jump bar at 6-3 $\frac{3}{4}$, topping by one-half inch a 1965 jump by Centennial's Dick Williams.

Three novice field records were also put into the Willamette books, Jeff Hammons and Dave Harrington, both of David Douglas, winning in the discus and pole vault for the younger entries, and Mike Fleer of McNary bettering all comers in the novice high jump.

Paz Clears 14

Clover Park Coach Darold Talley brought just his four distance preppers to the relays, but "next year we'll bring more if we can get the transportation," he stated.

He came this year because "we got the invitation, saw the record in the event and felt we could do the job."

Talley clocked his runners' splits as Brannan, 2:00.6; Burkhart, 2:04.9; Geralts, 2:00.8; and Smylie, 1:56.1.

"The wind bothered them a little," Talley said, pointing out that Geralts has run the half mile in well below two minutes.

Al Paz of Jesuit made an attempt at setting a new relays pole vault mark but was stopped at 14-0. The record is 14-1.

Paz, whose career best is 15-3, failed in his attempts to go over at 14-3. Regarding his problems at 14-3, Paz said that some recent back troubles "couldn't be called an excuse." He added, however, that the chilly weather and the long wait — over five hours — did bother him.

There was some Salem area flavor to several events as the
