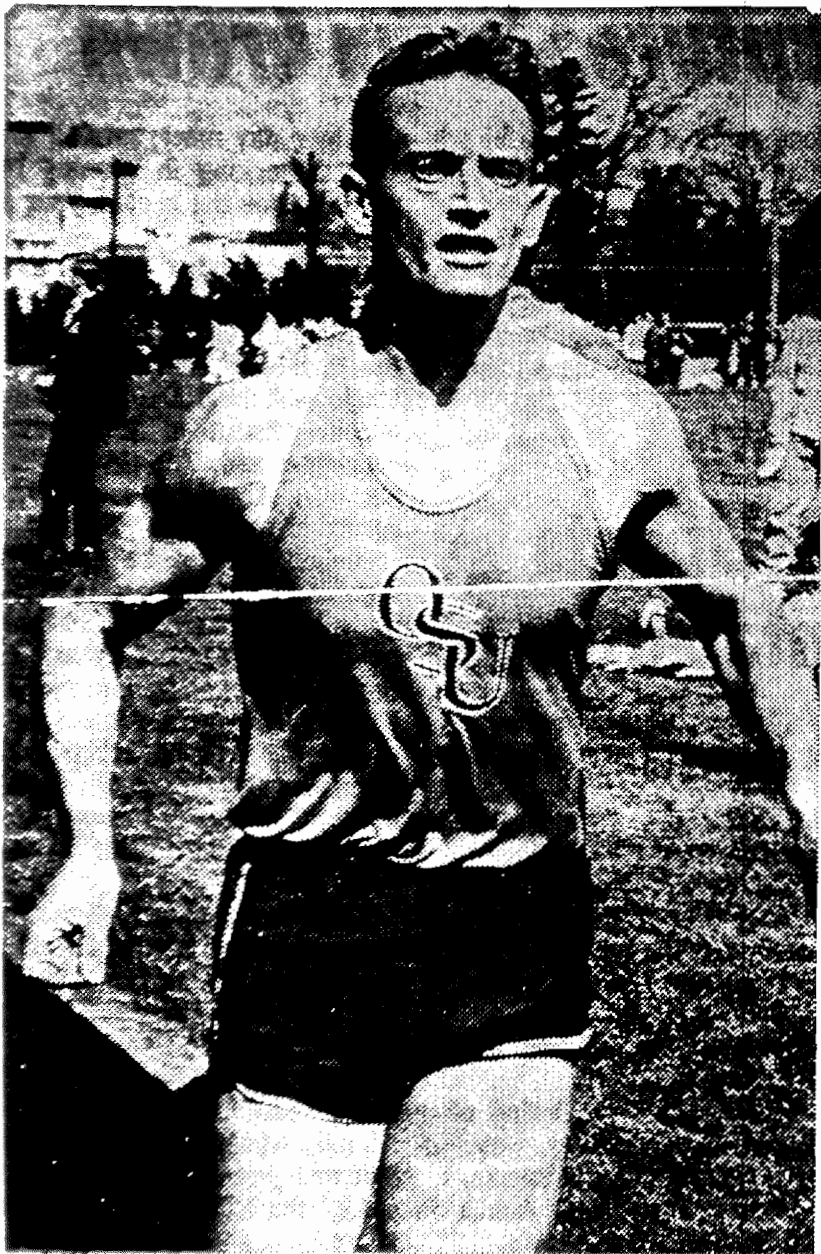

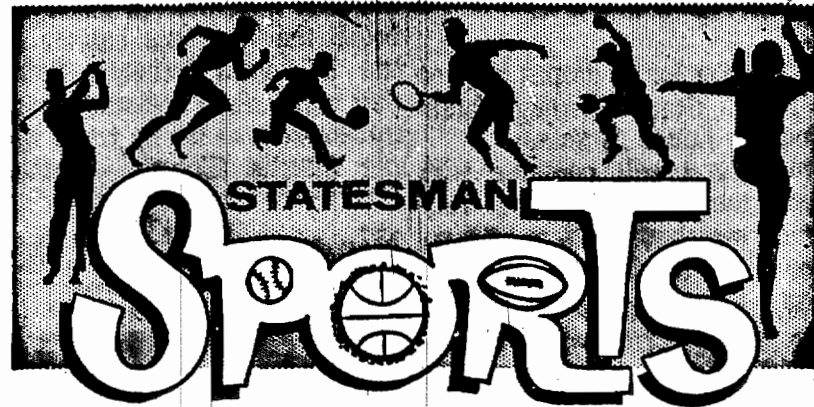

Bates, Pomeroy Key OSU in WU Relays

Terry Thompson, Oregon State's premier middle distance man, got the 18th annual Willamette Relays off and running Saturday at McCullough Stadium as he captured the Statesman Invitational Mile in 4:13.5 on a sunny, but chilly and windy day.

In the other feature events Oregon State Rook Onia Bates won the Oliver Huston Invitational 100-yard dash in 9.8, and Jay Pomeroy of the Rooks won the Vern Gilmore Invitational High Hurdles in 14.6.

None of the feature times were close to records, although before the day was over some 15 marks had tumbled as the 1,500 athletes in high school, college and open events, went through their paces.

Stars of the entire day had to be the Oregon State Varsity, Rooks, and Staters Track and Field Club, as they picked up 17 first between the three.

In the Statesman Mile, Thompson, the defending champion, held back for two laps as he let someone else set the pace. Jim Barkley of the Oregon State Rooks led the first lap in 63 seconds. Barkley was also ahead at the end of the half at 2:10, but Thompson and Roy Hammitt of the Oregon Track Club were making their moves. Hammit took over halfway through the lap and then Thompson took him on the last 100 to run the three quarters in 3:15.

Then Thompson turned on the speed and was clocked for the

final quarter in 58.5 for his 4:13.5 total time. Steve Savage of the Oregon Track club was second in 4:16.5, followed by Hammitt in 4:22.0; Barkley in 4:23.6 and Doug Gordon of Columbia Basin in 4:24.5.

Thompson, presented a big trophy by Charles A. Sprague, Editor and Publisher of The Oregon Statesman, was disappointed in his time as he clocked one race in 4:09 already this year. He said the wind was a factor in the time although the coolness of the day didn't bother him as he's an Oregonian.

Thompson also commented on his race saying he wanted those Oregon boys (Oregon Track Club) to make their bids first and then he'd move out. He was also disappointed that Dyrøl Burleson wasn't there as the time would have been much better with a good man to run against.

The Invitational Hurdles offered a disappointment also as the leading runner had trouble with the blocks and didn't even get to run, instead dropped out and ran the Open 120-yard

hurdles in a better (14.2) time than the Invitational's 14.6.

But the Invitational was a good race as Pomeroy nipped his teammate Leon Johnson by just a nose to win. Both ran good races and both had the same clocking.

Both Pomeroy and Johnson were pleased with the race and time as it was the first time this spring either had been under 15.0. The two said they had been running nip and tuck all spring, with Johnson maybe having just a little better of it.

The Open hurdles, a new event, was won by Oregon State's Don Parish in 14.2 which would have been a new record, snapping the old one of 14.3 in the Invitational set in 1966 by John Lee of Whitman.

In the Houston 100 another bit of bad luck happened as Harry Jerome, who has won the event three times in the past, scratched as he injured a leg slightly while running at Eugene on Friday.

But nevertheless, Jerome would have had a race of it as Oregon State's speedy freshman Onia Bates flashed across the

finish line in the good time of 9.8 on a day which didn't make for speedy running.

Second was Marv Pope of Mt. Hood College in 9.9. Bates, heralded as the next great sprinter from this state, was almost left sitting in the blocks as he got a poor start. But he made it up in a hurry. Bates said he would have liked to have Jerome in the race. Later on Bates anchored the Rooks to two relay records.

As we said before Oregon State had a big day. The varsity won eight events including Thompson in The Statesman Mile and Parish in the hurdles. The Rooks came home in front six times, including Bates in the Houston 100 and Pomeroy in the Gilmore Hurdles. And the Staters Track and Field Club took three events.

Listing the nine college records we find Oregon State's team of Ernie Smith, Steve Davis, Bobby Mays and Willie Turner taking the 440 in 41.3. The old mark was 41.5; Another OSU team won the two-mile relay in 7:48.3 snapping the mark of 7:48.6; A Staters quartet took the mile in 3:21.4 to lower the old standard of 3:22.3; A team from Simon Fraser in British Columbia grabbed the open mile in 3:21.8; Steve Kelly of Oregon State high jumped 6-10 to surpass the old mark of 6-8 $\frac{3}{4}$; Ken Patera of Portland Track Club put the shot 60-5 beating his own mark of 60-4; Don Tollefson of the Staters, an ex-North Salem High lad, flipped the discus 179-7 to eclipse the old record of 172-6 $\frac{3}{4}$; and Dennis Phillips of Oregon State pole vaulted 15-7 to beat the old mark of 15-2.

an ex-North Salem high jumper flipped the discus 179-7 to eclipse the old record of 172-6¾; and Dennis Phillips of Oregon State pole vaulted 15-7 to beat the old mark of 15-2.

The high schoolers snapped six marks, all in the field events. In the senior discus Steve Athay of Ft. LOS ANGELES (AP) — Kansas jumper Ken Gaines scored two victories and placed second in another event Saturday afternoon to lead the Jayhawks to a convincing 102-42 triumph over UCLA in a dual track meet.

Gaines won the high jump at 6 foot 6 inches and took the triple jump in a meet record 50-2. He also placed second to UCLA's John Johnson in the long jump at 23-5¼. Johnson went 24-2.

The Bruins, hard hit with injuries, won only four events—the shot put, discus, 440 and long jump.
